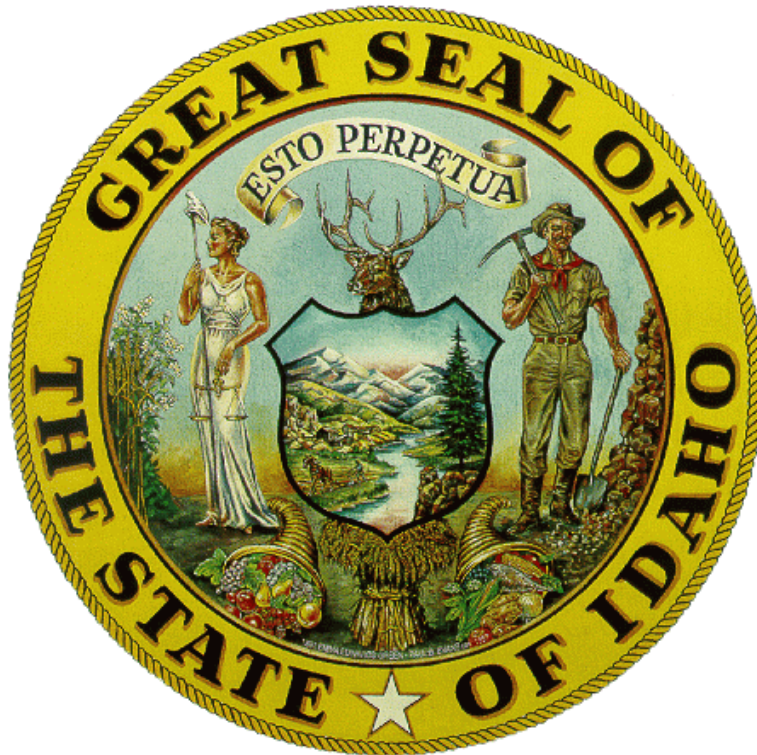

◆ **Open Forum**

City and County Concerns - No items or concerns were brought forth.

Master Electrician License - After the topic *Challenge/Placement Tests* was discussed, the Chairman reverted back to "Open Forum" for this issue.

To qualify to take the Idaho Master Electrician exam, Idaho statute and rule requires an individual to be a licensed journeyman electrician for a period of not less than four (4) years.

Paul McNamara, California Electrical Contractor, explained his work experience as a contractor; however, unable to provide proof he has been a licensed journeyman electrician, Mr. McNamara asked the Board to make an exception and allow him to take the Idaho Master Electrician exam.

Neither the Board nor DBS have the authority to make exceptions. It was suggested, and Mr. McNamara agreed, to work with the Deputy Administrator-Operations and bring a proposed amendment to the Idaho Code at the April 2016 Board meeting.

MOTION: Paul McNamara and the Deputy Administrator-Operations will bring to the April 2016 Electrical Board meeting a draft proposal; changing the requirements to take the Idaho Master Electrician License exam.

ACTION: The topic *Master Electrician License* will be placed on the April 2016 Board meeting agenda as an informational item.

◆ **Approval of the January 21, 2016 Agenda**

Chairman Scott requested the topic *DBS Website/Credited CEU Hours* be added to the agenda as the first informational item.

MOTION: Joe Harbacheck made a motion to approve the agenda as amended. Allan Perman seconded. All in favor, motion carried.

◆ **Approval of the October 22, 2015 Board Meeting Minutes**

MOTION: Dale Pippitt made a motion to approve the minutes as written. Allan Perman seconded. All in favor, motion carried.

◆ **DBS Website/Credited CEU Hours**

The DBS IT Resource Manager demonstrated the changes being made to the Division's software program "e-TRAKiT" that pertain to Continuing Education Unit "CEU" hours and online renewals.

◆ **Challenge/Placement Tests**

Representatives from the Idaho Division of Professional-Technical Education (PTE) provided an overview of its Electrical Apprenticeship Standards Development and Assessment project. The objective is to create end-of-course exams for years one through three.

The following individuals participated in setting school standards, years one through three, of the Electrical Apprenticeship program for the state of Idaho: Dale Moore, Idaho Transportation Department/Lewis-Clark State College; Kelly Lamp, Southwest Idaho Electrical JATC; Jim McElwain, Idaho Forest Group; Robert Behr, Eastern Idaho Technical College; Jim Webb, College of Western Idaho; Bill Stokes, Wendell Electric; Chuck Williams, North Idaho College and Chris Lockridge, Idaho State University Training Center.

MOTION: Rick Stark made a motion to: 1) Take no exception to the standards, or 2) In general, approve as a basis for an educational system. Allan Perman seconded.

This topic is under the informational agenda; therefore, no motion is required. The Board appreciates the actions of PTE and would like to see them continue with the criticality assessment.

◆ **Appeals**

As requested at a previous meeting, copies of letters the Division issues for correction notice(s) and notice of violation(s) were distributed to the Board.

◆ **Submersible Pumps**

The Division is still in the process of meeting with industry and interested parties on the listing and labeling of submersible pumps in lakes and rivers.

◆ **Solar Panel Installations**

As requested at a previous meeting, the Electrical Program Manager stated photovoltaic (PV) licensees can work on solar PV DC systems and solar PV micro-inverter/AC systems.

◆ **Program Manager Report**

Electrical Program Web Page - The Division's Electrical Program web page has been updated to include the following: 1) Link to "Find Your Electrical Inspector Here", 2) Facebook "like" icon, and 3) Subcategories "Idaho Electrical Policies, Procedures and Interpretations", "Useful Information", "Documents" and "Frequently Asked Questions".

Temporary Pole Connection Policy - A permit for temporary pole service is \$65.00. In the past, contractors have pulled permits and utility companies have connected the power. Many years later, inspectors are called to the job site only to find it has been wired for years without a final inspection. The Division is looking for a solution to this problem.

Voluntary PV Plan Review - Recently, the Division introduced a "voluntary" PV plan review process for all solar PV installations prior to the beginning of the installation. An early plan review will reduce costs to contractors and homeowners, as well as avoid project delays. A checklist of items to be submitted to the DBS prior to the installation of a project is available on the electrical page of the Division's website under Program Manager Bulletin.

Notice of Violation (NOV) Report

Upon reviewing the NOV report, the Chairman questioned the vast difference between the fees charged and the fees paid for the period of October 1, 2015 through December 31, 2015.

The NOV process was explained. The Division is limited on the method in which to enforce the collection of fees on unlicensed individuals and homeowners. Therefore, those accounts are referred to a collection agency.

The Deputy Administrator-Operations offered to bring to the April Board meeting a current summary of the Electrical program's collected versus uncollected fees and a more detailed NOV report.

ACTION: For the April meeting the Deputy Administrator-Operations will bring: 1) Current summary of collected versus uncollected NOV fees, and 2) Detailed NOV report.

◆ **Compliance Program Supervisor Report**

Beginning April 5, 2016, the Compliance Program Supervisor will provide public works classes in all 44 counties in the state of Idaho.

◆ **Operational Report**

Legislation - the 2016 Legislature is in session. The Electrical Board did not have any draft legislation this year.

Required Inspections - Currently, there is no requirement for contractors to request inspections. Annually, thousands of permits are issued; however, jobs go uninspected. As previously requested, draft language was presented to require contractors to request inspections of electrical facilities. The Deputy Administrator-Operations offered to bring a formal proposal to the April Board meeting.

ACTION: For the April meeting, the Deputy Administrator-Operations will bring a formal proposal that would require contractors to request inspections.

2017 National Electrical Code (NEC) - It was suggested the Board contemplate the negotiation of the next edition of the electrical code through a collaborative group.

The Deputy Administrator-Operations offered to bring to the April Board meeting updated information on the 2017 NEC.

ACTION: For the April meeting, the Deputy Administrator-Operations will bring information on the 2017 NEC.

◆ **Administrator Report**

Financial Report - The Electrical Board Fund, FY 2016 financial statement as of December 30, 2015, was reviewed.

Budget - The Division has requested the addition of four inspectors and one clerical full-time position. The Governor's FY 2017 Budget recommendation includes the Division's request. On February 5th, the Administrator will make his budget presentation to the Joint Finance-Appropriations Committee.

The Governor approved a three percent salary increase for all state employees. The three percent is allocated on a meritorious basis.

City of Meridian - On October 1, 2015, the Division signed a contract with the city of Meridian; expanding its services to include building inspections and plan reviews.

◆ **Submersible Pumps Legislation**

Several months ago the Division met in northern Idaho with representatives of the pump industry to discuss wiring methodologies for the installation of submersible well pumps in lakes. The Electrical Program Manager discovered submersible well pumps are not listed, tested or approved for the application which places them directly in a body of water. A policy statement was issued by the DBS and, in essence, it is unable to allow the installation of new and/or replacement of existing pumps in bodies of water.

Pump owners went to legislators on this issue. It was determined the use of such pumps is not adequately covered by the National Electrical Code (NEC), which is adopted as Idaho's electrical code by the Idaho Electrical Board. Senator Nonini, with assistance from Jeremy Pisca, Risch Pisca, PLLC, created draft legislation that would: 1) Remove sections of the NEC from Idaho's adoption of the code, 2) Direct the DBS to create rules governing the use, inspection and safety of the pumps, and 3) Create a sunset date of two years to allow industry

and regulators a chance to work collaboratively on a solution. The proposal is sponsored by Senator Nonini and co-sponsored by Representatives Barbieri and Redman.

With the use of a diagram, the Division presented a temporary working solution. The basic features are: 1) Ground fault protection no more than ten (10) milliamps (mA), 2) Protection of all the cabling going to the pump, 3) Redundant grounding to a separate ground wire to be run to either a piece of well casing or metal cage around the pump, 4) Wiring installation in accordance to NEC Article 682, and 5) Signage.

Jim Riley, Executive Board Member, Coeur d'Alene Lakeshore Property Owners Association, voiced his opinion on this matter.

Board Member LaBolle was disconnected from the teleconference call and did not return to the meeting.

MOTION: Dale Pippitt made a motion to not support the legislation as presented. Rick Stark seconded. All in favor, motion carried.

The Chairman asked for a motion on whether or not to follow the course the Division has outlined. Hearing none, the Chairman was content for the DBS to move forward with its solution.

◆ **Submersible Pumps Legislation**

The Board was asked by Senator Nonini and stakeholders in northern Idaho to reconsider its opposition to House Bill 615 as it relates to new and retro-fit systems used in lakes, rivers, ponds and streams.

Senator Nonini sponsored, and Representatives Barbieri and Redman co-sponsored, House Bill 615. The bill would: 1) Add a new section to Chapter 10, Title 54, Idaho Code; 2) NEC Articles 110.3(A), 110.3(B) and 682 would not apply to specific use of the pumps; 3) DBS to promulgate rules; 4) Two-year sunset clause; and 5) Effective upon sine die of the 2016 Legislature.

It was suggested a collaborative group be assigned to find a reasonable standard or interim standard for the use of pumps and how they are wired, as well as negotiate standards for other electrical installations around bodies of water. The Administrator recommended at least one meeting be conducted in northern Idaho.

MOTION: Joe Harbacheck made a motion that the Board does not oppose the current proposed legislation. Allan Perman seconded.

AMENDED MOTION: Joe Harbacheck made a motion that the Board does not oppose House Bill 615. Allan Perman seconded. Five ayes, one nay, motion carried.

Regional Manager, Region 3, explained that Watertronics, a Lindsey Company, has produced a High Density Polyethylene (HDPE) submerged pump system called BlackMAX™. A variety of models is available to handle a wide assortment of irrigation applications from 50 GPM to 1500 GPM.

Chairman Scott stated that while there are a lot of drownings/deaths in public waters in Idaho, none of them have been substantiated as having been caused by submersible pumps.

The Chairman suggested, and the Administrator offered, to send to each county coroner in the state of Idaho a survey with regard to drownings in the vicinity of submersible pumps in public waters.

ACTION: The Division will send a survey to each county coroner regarding submersible pumps in the vicinity of drownings/deaths in Idaho public waters.

CHAPTER 08**

IDAPA 07 - DIVISION OF BUILDING SAFETY

07.01.08 - RULES GOVERNING ELECTRICAL SAFETY INSPECTIONS

000. LEGAL AUTHORITY.

The Idaho Electrical Board is authorized under Sections 54-1005, and 54-1006, Idaho Code, to adopt rules concerning the inspections of electrical installations referred to in Section 54-1001, Idaho Code.

001. TITLE AND SCOPE.

These rules shall be cited as IDAPA 07.01.02, "Rules Governing Electrical Safety Inspections," Division of Building Safety. These rules include criteria for the inspection of electrical installations, and govern the appeal of electrical inspection determinations where the Division has determined that an electrical installation does not meet the requirements of state law, the administrative rules promulgated by the electrical board, or the National Electrical Code as adopted by the state of Idaho.

002. WRITTEN INTERPRETATIONS.

This agency has written interpretations of this chapter.

(2-26-93)

003. ADMINISTRATIVE APPEALS.

This chapter does not allow administrative relief of the provisions outlined herein.

(2-26-93)

004. REQUIRED INSPECTIONS.

The permit holder must request inspections of the following types of electrical installations:

- 01. Concealed Work.** Before electrical installation work is backfilled, covered by drywall, insulation, or other building components, or embedded in concrete or similar substances, the permit holder shall request an inspection of the installation.
- 02. Service Equipment.** Before electrical service equipment is energized, the permit holder shall request an inspection of the installation.
- 03. Temporary Service Installations.** Before a temporary electrical service is energized, the permit holder shall request an inspection of the installation.
- 04. Final Inspection.** Upon completion of the electrical installation, the permit holder shall request a final inspection.

005. POWER SUPPLY COMPANIES

The Division of Building Safety shall notify the power supplier when an electrical installation has been inspected and approved for the connection of service. In the event that the power supplier has not received notice from the division of building safety that the electrical installation has been inspected and improved, and deems it necessary to energize an electrical installation without delay to preserve life or property, the power company shall notify the division that the installation has been energized.

006. APPEALS OF ELECTRICAL INSPECTION INTERPRETATIONS

In order to determine the suitability of materials and methods of wiring and to provide for interpretations of the provisions of the National Electrical Code, the creation of an electrical appeals board is hereby authorized by the administrator of the Division of Building Safety, to be composed of three (3) members of the Idaho Electrical Board, or an electrical supervisor and two (2) members of the Idaho Electrical Board, as determined and selected by the administrator upon receipt of a written notice of appeal as set forth below. (7-1-98)

01. Notice of Appeal. A person, firm, or corporation making an electrical installation subject to the provisions of Title 54, Chapter 10, Idaho Code, may appeal, to the administrator, a decision by the Electrical Bureau chief, chief electrical inspector, or other electrical inspector, that a particular electrical installation is not in conformance with Idaho Code, these rules, or the National Electrical Code as adopted by Idaho law. An appeal must be lodged by filing a written notice of appeal with the administrator within ten (10) days of the date of issuance of a notice of defects issued pursuant to Section 54-1004, Idaho Code. The notice of appeal shall state in particular the reasons why the appellant contends that the notice of defects is incorrect. (7-1-98)

02. Filing Date. If mailed, the notice of appeal shall be considered filed as of the date of postmark. The mailing address for filing such notice of appeal shall be to the administrator, Division of Building Safety, P.O. Box 83720, Boise, Idaho, 83720-0028. (7-1-98)

03. Appeals Board. The members of the Idaho Electrical Board and other persons appointed by the administrator to act as the appeals board, are authorized to hold hearings at the Division of Building Safety in Meridian Boise, Idaho, to determine the merits of an appeal filed pursuant to this rule. (7-1-98)

04. Function of Appeals Board. The members of the Idaho Electrical Board, acting as an appeals board, shall not have the authority to grant variances from the National Electrical Code; its sole function as an appeals board shall be to determine whether the materials or method of wiring utilized by the appellant meets the requirements of the National Electrical Code. (11-5-81)

05. Appeals Hearing Fee. An appeals hearing fee of one hundred dollars (\$100) shall be charged to an appellant for each appeal brought before the appeals board. The appeals hearing fee shall accompany the notice of appeal. When the appeal is found in favor of the appellant, the appeals hearing fee shall be returned to the appellant. (11-5-81)

06. Conditions Disqualifying Board Member. No Idaho Electrical Board member shall sit on an appeals board in which he or his employer, employee, business partner or any person related to him, is the appellant in the matter. or where he has a pecuniary interest in the outcome of the matter to be decided by the appeals board. (7-1-98)

07. Rules of Evidence. The rules of evidence for the hearing are governed by the Idaho Administrative Procedures Act, Title 67, Chapter 52, Idaho Code. (11-5-81)

08. Limitations of Appeal. The filing of an appeal does not stay or discontinue a notice of correction, notice of violation, red tag, disconnect order, or notification to the power company not to energize, in situations where the defect is of a nature so as to be an imminent threat to life or property. (11-5-81)

09. Preliminary Order. Within five (5) days of the conclusion of the administrative hearing, the appeals board shall issue a preliminary order. The preliminary order will become a final order without further notice unless reviewed by the administrator, or review is requested by any party to the inspection tag appeal, pursuant to the provisions of Section 67-5245, Idaho Code. When a preliminary order is reviewed by the administrator, the administrator will issue a final order pursuant to the requirements of Sections 67-5245 and 67-5246, Idaho Code. (7-1-98)

10. Motions for Reconsideration. Motions for reconsideration of the appeal board's preliminary order or of the administrator's final order are not allowed.

006. EXEMPTION FROM ATTORNEY GENERAL'S ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE RULES FOR CONTESTED CASES.

Pursuant to Section 67-5206(5), Idaho Code, the procedures contained in Subchapter B, "Contested Cases," of IDAPA 04.11.01, "Idaho Rules of Administrative Procedure of the Attorney General," Sections 100 through 799 do not apply to electrical inspection ~~interpretation~~ appeals. (7-1-98)

007. REASONS FOR EXEMPTION FROM ATTORNEY GENERAL'S ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE RULES.

In order to protect consumers from unsafe electrical installations and to prevent unnecessary delays and increased costs in construction projects, the rules of procedure in this chapter are adopted to promote the speedy resolution of contested cases involving electrical inspection ~~interpretation~~ appeals. (7-1-98)

IDAPA 07 - DIVISION OF BUILDING SAFETY

07.01.01 - RULES GOVERNING ELECTRICAL ~~PERMITS~~INSPECTION TAGS

000. LEGAL AUTHORITY.

The Idaho Electrical Board is authorized under Sections 54-1005, and 54-1006, Idaho Code, to adopt rules concerning the issuance of electrical ~~permits~~inspection tags covering electrical installations referred to in Section 54-1001, Idaho Code.

~~(2-26-93)~~

001. TITLE AND SCOPE.

These rules shall be cited as IDAPA 07.01.01, “Rules Governing Electrical ~~Permits~~Inspection Tags,” Division of Building Safety. These rules include criteria for the use of electrical ~~permits~~inspection tags for electrical installations issued under the provisions of Title 54, Chapter 10, Idaho Code.

- 01. Accessory~~s~~associated Buildings.** All buildings, structures, and fixtures used for domestic purposes and in connection with the primary or secondary residence, such as garages, sheds, ~~hobby~~ barns, or shops.
- 02. Division.** ~~The Division of Building Safety of the state of Idaho.~~
- 03. Board.** ~~The Idaho Electrical Board.~~

005. -- 010. (RESERVED)

011. ELECTRICAL ~~PERMITS~~INSPECTION TAGS.

Electrical ~~Permits~~Inspection tags as authorized by Section 54-1005, Idaho Code, shall each bear a serial number.(4-2-08)

012. ELECTRICAL CONTRACTORS' ~~PERMITS~~INSPECTION TAGS.

Electrical contractors' inspection tags shall be furnished by the Division of Building Safety to licensed electrical contractors upon request. The serial numbers of such tags shall be registered in the name of the electrical contractor to whom they are issued and they shall not be transferable. Electrical ~~permits~~inspection tags issued to an ~~applicant~~electrical contractor shall be used only for electrical installations made by said ~~applicant~~electrical contractor and for which said ~~applicant~~electrical contractor assumes full responsibility.

~~(4-2-08)~~

01. Completion of Electrical ~~Permit~~ Application~~Inspection Tag~~. For each electrical installation made by an electrical contractor and coming under the provisions of Section 54-1001, Idaho Code, ~~the exempt property owner, the industrial account, the electrical~~ said contractor or ~~its~~his authorized representative shall complete an electrical ~~permit~~inspection tag application, issued by the Division of Building Safety, giving all pertinent information. The name of the ~~applicant~~electrical contractor shall be stated and the ~~application~~tag shall be ~~submitted~~signed by the ~~applicant~~electrical contractor or his authorized agent. ~~The application shall be accompanied~~

by the required fee for the electrical permit. (4-2-08)

02. Possession of Valid Electrical Permit~~Posting of Electrical Inspection Tag~~. Before work is commenced, the ~~applicant~~electrical contractor or his authorized representative shall **obtain a valid electrical permit** place a copy of the electrical inspection tag at the location of the service switch and mail or deliver a copy to the power supplier. An application, together with the proper inspection fee as herein provided, shall be received by the Division of Building Safety within seven (7) calendar days from the time the electrical work is started. Where the total cost of installation is unknown, the minimum ~~permit~~inspection fee as listed in IDAPA 07.01.02, "Rules Governing Fees For Electrical Inspections," Subsection 011.06 of the fee schedule shall accompany the **permit application**tag and arrangements shall be made, in writing, with the Division of Building Safety or its authorized agent for payment of the balance of the fee. In all cases, payment of the total inspection fee shall be made prior to completion of the installation. (4-2-08)

~~a.~~ The Division of Building Safety may refuse to extend credit to any electrical contractor for late payment or non payment of any electrical inspection fees when due. In such instance, the contractor shall return all unused permits to the Division of Building Safety forthwith. No further permits will be issued to the contractor unless prepaid in cash or cash equivalent. Such contractor will not be allowed to purchase further permits unless and until all such unused permits have been returned to the Division of Building Safety, Meridian, and all outstanding fees due have been paid in full. (4-2-08)

~~b.~~ Failure to post a copy of the electrical inspection tag at the required location, or **Failure to submit an application of such tag and the proper inspection fee to the Division of Building Safety within seven (7) calendar days from the time obtain an electrical permit prior to commencing** the electrical installation work is commenced will result in the imposition of a double ~~permit~~inspection fee. (4-2-08)

c. No electrical inspections shall be provided without **a valid electrical permit covering the installation being made**the Division of Building Safety receiving an application for a tag along with the proper fee. (4-2-08)

~~013. ELECTRICAL LICENSING EXEMPTION FOR HOME OWNERS AND MAINTENANCE ELECTRICIANS; INSPECTION TAG REQUIREMENTS.~~

The licensing provisions of Title 54, Chapter 10, Idaho Code, and IDAPA 07.01.03, "Rules Governing Electrical Licensing," do not apply to the following pursuant to Section 54 1016, Idaho Code: (7-1-98)

~~01. Home Owner Installations.~~ Home owners making installations on their own primary residence, secondary residence, and buildings associated with these residences that are not used for commercial purposes. (4-2-08)

~~02. Maintenance Electricians.~~ Maintenance electricians employed full time only to service, maintain, assemble, or repair ~~EXISTING~~ electrical installations located on their employers' premises. (2-23-94)

~~03. Procedures for Inspection Tags for Exempt Home Owners.~~ Persons exempt from licensing pursuant to Subsection 013.01 of this rule must still secure all electrical inspection tags required by Section 54 1005, Idaho Code, before making any electrical installation. No electrical wiring or equipment may be concealed in any manner from access or sight until the work has been inspected and approved for cover by the electrical inspector. A final inspection shall be made upon the completion of all electrical work. The procedure for obtaining inspection tags follows: (4-2-08)

~~a.~~ Any exempt person shall obtain an application form from the Division of Building Safety, either at its Meridian main office or at designated locations. The application form shall be properly completed, signed, and forwarded to the Division of Building Safety, 1090 E. Watertower Street, Meridian, Idaho 83642, with the proper inspection fee as provided for in these rules. (4-2-08)

~~b.~~ Upon receipt of the properly completed application together with the proper inspection fee, the Division of Building Safety shall immediately issue an electrical inspection tag for the electrical installation

designated in the application. (4-2-08)

c. A copy of an electrical inspection tag shall be retained by the Division of Building Safety. A copy of an electrical inspection tag shall be forwarded to the applicant and shall be placed on the location of the service, and a copy of an electrical inspection tag shall be forwarded to the state electrical inspector who will make the electrical inspection as provided by Sections 54-1004 and 54-1005, Idaho Code. (4-2-08)

d. A copy of an electrical inspection tag shall be forwarded or delivered to the power supplier by the Division of Building Safety. (4-2-08)

014. ELECTRICAL INSPECTION TAG REQUIREMENTS FOR INDUSTRIAL ACCOUNTS.

Companies, firms, associations, or corporations who use employees to make electrical installations coming under the provisions of Section 54-1001, Idaho Code, on their own premises, must establish an Industrial Account with the Division of Building Safety and secure electrical inspection tags by making application to the Division of Building Safety. Employees performing non-maintenance electrical installations on an Industrial Account must be licensed electrical journeymen as provided by Section 54-1002(2), Idaho Code. One (1) properly licensed employee shall be designated the supervising journeyman for the Industrial Account with the Division of Building Safety. (4-2-08)

01. **Application Forms.** The application form shall be properly completed, signed by the property owner or agent of the company, firm, association, or corporation, and forwarded to the Division of Building Safety, 1090 E. Watertower Street, Meridian, Idaho 83642, with the proper inspection fee as hereinafter provided. (4-2-08)

02. **Posting of Electrical Inspection Tag.** Upon receipt of a properly completed application from a property owner, company, firm, association, or corporation for an electrical inspection tag, together with the proper inspection fee, the Division of Building Safety shall immediately issue an electrical inspection tag for the electrical installations designated in the application. A copy of an electrical inspection tag shall be retained by the Division of Building Safety. A copy of an electrical inspection tag shall be forwarded to the applicant and shall be placed at the location of the service switch. A copy of an electrical inspection tag shall be forwarded or delivered to the power supplier, and a copy shall be forwarded to the state electrical inspector who will make the electrical inspection as provided by Sections 54-1004 and 54-1005, Idaho Code. (4-2-08)

03. **Power Supply Company.** In the event the power supplier deems it necessary to energize an electrical installation without delay to preserve life or property, the power supply company may accept the application properly completed and signed, with the proper inspection fee attached, in lieu of the electrical inspection tag required by Section 54-1004, Idaho Code, provided the power supply company or its authorized agent shall assume the responsibility of forwarding the application and inspection fee to the Division of Building Safety, 1090 E. Watertower Street, Meridian, Idaho 83642. The Division of Building Safety shall, upon request, furnish application forms and self-addressed envelopes to power supply companies operating within the state of Idaho. (4-2-08)

015. TEMPORARIES.

Temporaries for construction may be energized by power suppliers upon receipt of a copy of an inspection tag purchased from the Division of Building Safety. (4-2-08)

07.01.11 - RULES GOVERNING CIVIL PENALTIES

000. LEGAL AUTHORITY.

The Idaho Electrical Board is authorized under Section 54-1006(5), Idaho Code, to establish by administrative rule the civil penalty to be paid for citations issued. (3-30-01)

001. TITLE AND SCOPE.

01. Title. These rules shall be cited as IDAPA 07.01.11, "Rules Governing Civil Penalties," Division of Building Safety. (3-30-01)

02. Scope. These rules establish the criteria and amount of civil penalties to be levied for violations of Title 54, Chapter 10, Idaho Code, and IDAPA 07.01.03, "Rules of Electrical Licensing and Registration." (3-30-01)

002. WRITTEN INTERPRETATIONS.

This agency has no written interpretations of this chapter. (3-30-01)

003. ADMINISTRATIVE APPEALS.

Upon notice of a civil penalty, the notified party shall within ten (10) days comply with the penalty or file a written request for a hearing for appeal with the Idaho Electrical Board. Bond in the amount of the penalty shall accompany the request for hearing. (3-30-01)

004. INCORPORATION BY REFERENCE.

There are no documents that have been incorporated by reference into this rule. (3-30-01)

005. OFFICE -- OFFICE HOURS -- MAILING ADDRESS AND STREET ADDRESS.

The principal place of business of the Division of Building Safety, Electrical Bureau is in Meridian, Idaho. The office is located at 1090. E. Watertower Street, Suite 150, Meridian, Idaho and is open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., except Saturday, Sunday and legal holidays. 011. CIVIL PENALTIES.

The following acts shall subject the violator to penalties based on the following schedule. (3-30-01)

01. Electrical Contractor. Except as provided by Section 54-1016, Idaho Code, any person who acts, or purports to act as an electrical contractor, as defined by Section 54-1003A, Idaho Code, without a valid Idaho state electrical contractor's license shall be subject to a civil penalty of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500) for the first offense and a civil penalty of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for each offense thereafter. (3-30-01)

02. Employees. Any person, who knowingly employs a person who does not hold a valid Idaho state electrical license or registration as required by Section 54-1010, Idaho Code, and IDAPA 07.01.03, "Rules of Electrical Licensing and Registration," to perform electrical installations, shall be subject to a civil penalty of not more than two hundred dollars (\$200) for the first offense and a civil penalty of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for each offense thereafter. (3-30-01)

03. License or Registration. Except as provided by Section 54-1016, Idaho Code, any person performing electrical work as a journeyman electrician as defined by Section 54-1003A(2), Idaho Code, specialty

electrician as defined by Section 54-1003A(6), Idaho Code, apprentice electrician as defined by Section 54-1003A(3), Idaho Code, or a specialty electrical trainee as defined by Section 54-1003A(8), Idaho Code, without a valid license or registration shall be subject to a civil penalty of not more than two hundred dollars (\$200) for the first offense and a civil penalty of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for each offense thereafter. (3-30-01)

04. Journeyman to Apprentice Ratio. Any electrical contractor or industrial account employing electricians in violation of the journeyman to apprentice ratio established by the Idaho Electrical Board shall be subject to a civil penalty of not more than two hundred dollars (\$200) for the first offense and a civil penalty of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for each offense thereafter. (3-30-01)

05. Supervision. Any contractor failing to provide constant on-the-job supervision to apprentice electricians by a qualified journeyman electrician shall be subject to a civil penalty of not more than two hundred dollars (\$200) for the first offense and a civil penalty of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for each offense thereafter. (3-30-01)

06. Performance Outside Scope of License. Any specialty electrical contractor or specialty electrical journeyman performing electrical installations, alterations or maintenance outside the scope of the specialty electrical license shall be subject to a civil penalty of not more than two hundred dollars (\$200) for the first offense and a civil penalty of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for each offense thereafter. (3-30-01)

07. Fees and Permits. Any person failing to pay applicable fees or properly post an electrical permit shall be subject to a civil penalty of not more than two hundred dollars (\$200) for the first offense and a civil penalty of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for each offense thereafter. (3-30-01)

08. Corrections. Any person who fails to make corrections in the time allotted in the notice on any electrical installation as set forth in Section 54-1004, Idaho Code, shall be subject to a civil penalty of not more than two hundred dollars (\$200) for the first offense and a civil penalty of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for each offense thereafter. (3-30-01)

09. Failure to Disclose. Any applicant for an electrical registration, license, or certificate of competency who upon request fails to disclose any required information including, but not limited to, their complete licensure history or the fact that they have been previously licensed as a journeyman or master electrician in any recognized jurisdiction, shall be subject to a civil penalty of not more than two hundred dollars (\$200) for the first offense and a civil penalty of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for each offense thereafter. (4-11-15)

10. Permits. Any exempt property owner, industrial account holder, electrical contractor, or specialty electrical contractor who fails to obtain an electrical permit prior to commencing electrical work requiring a permit, shall be subject to a civil penalty of not more than two hundred dollars (\$200) for the first offense and a civil penalty of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for each offense thereafter.

11. Failure to request a required inspection. Any permit holder who fails to request a required inspection shall be subject to a civil penalty of not more than two hundred dollars (\$200) for the first offense and a civil penalty of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for each offense thereafter.

120. Gross Violation. In the case of continued, repeated or gross violation of Title 54, Chapter 10, Idaho Code, or IDAPA 07.01.03, a license revocation shall be initiated for licensees under this chapter and nonlicensees shall be subject to prosecution by the appropriate jurisdiction under Idaho law. (3-30-01)

131. Judicial Review. Any party aggrieved by the final action of the Idaho Electrical Board shall be entitled to a judicial review thereof in accordance with the provisions of Title 67, Chapter 52, Idaho Code. (3-30-01)
