MCP – Maintenance Control Plans

- 1. MCP's are required by our adopted code
- 2. Onsite requirements are a must and may not be taken away when there is a service company switch. They belong to the owner of the elevator.
- 3. No one size fits all but all companies need to work towards having one for each elevator
- 4. Enforcement is moving forward slowly

## **♦ Questions**

Does the State of Idaho have a process/requirement for reporting personal injuries from an elevator or major accident on the equipment of an elevator?

**Answer:** The State has a process for reporting injuries that result in immediate medical attention on site, one or more days of loss of work or hospitalization. There is no process in place to report major accidents to equipment but the division encourages elevator companies and owners to make use aware.
