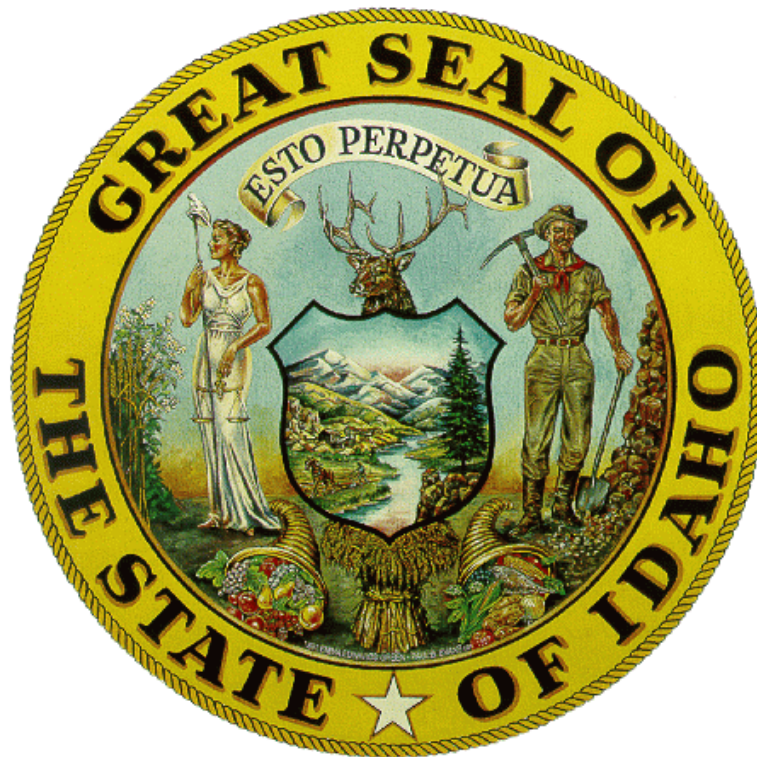

***DRAFT MINUTES OF THE MARCH 21, 2019 MEETING**

Chairman Matt Gardner called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. (MDT)

◆ **Recognition**

Chairman Gardner recognized Board Member Debbie Oberhofer for her many years of service on the Idaho Plumbing Board.

◆ **Open Forum**

There were no new issues to address during open forum.

City and County Concerns – There were no new issues to address during open forum.

◆ **Approval of the March 21, 2019 Agenda and January 17, 2019 Minutes**

MOTION: Gilbert Pond made a motion to approve the March 21, 2019 agenda and January 17, 2019 draft minutes as presented. Shaun Urwin seconded. All in favor, motion carried.

◆ **Continuing Education Units (CEU)**

Board Member Gilbert Pond expressed concern that CE Broker does not approve additional credit when a CEU course, with the same course number, is taken multiple times in a licensing period. It is his understanding the intent of the plumbing rule is any CEU course taken, regardless of course number, approved by DBS, is allowable and should be accepted.

Board Member Rick Garrett emphasized CEUs are to broaden a plumber's experience and knowledge; therefore, additional credit should not be given when taking the same course multiple times.

Upon further discussion, the problem seems to be with online versus classroom courses. Online courses do not change from year to year; however, classroom courses, with same course number, are taught every year but with different material.

Board Member Oberhofer addressed the bizarre format the current list of approved plumbing courses in Idaho is when downloading from the Division's website. Licensing and Permitting Supervisor Laura Shankel will investigate this issue.

For the May 2019 Board meeting, the Chairman asked DBS to provide input on what it will take to be able to get credit for classroom versus online courses.

Another issue by Board Member Pond is to get a free ID number with CE Broker, an individual must go down to the bottom of their website to apply, which is very confusing. Mrs. Shankel will research this as well.

ACTION: The Division will provide, at the May 2019 Board meeting, information on credit for classroom versus online courses, printable version of current list of approved plumbing courses in Idaho, and location for free ID number on CE Broker's website.

ACTION: The topic *Continuing Education Units (CEU)* will be placed as an informational item on the May 2019 Plumbing Board Meeting agenda.

◆ **Eliminate Specialty License for “Mobile Home Set-Up or Installers”**

There has been discussion to get rid of the mobile home installers license since there are currently two licenses. The original plan was to go to the 2020 legislature and remove the rule in plumbing, which is in the packet. However, it was determined the statute needs to be amended first. Currently, a mobile home permit is pulled for the installation of manufactured and mobile homes. For less confusion, changes have been made where each industry will need its own permits. A handout of proposed changes to Idaho Code §§ 54-2602 *Exceptions* and 54-2620 *Permits Required-Exceptions* was provided. If the proposed changes are approved at the 2020 legislature, the Division will clean up the rule for presentation at the 2021 legislature.

The Division will notice up the agenda for the May 2019 meeting as negotiated rulemaking and an action item.

Teri Ottens, Idaho Housing Alliance, expressed they are in favor of the change and urge the Board to move forward.

ACTION: As part of the negotiated rulemaking process, the Plumbing Program Manager will provide proposed statute changes at the May 2019 Board meeting.

ACTION: The topic *Eliminate Specialty License for “Mobile Home Set-Up or Installers”* will be placed as an action item on the May 2019 Plumbing Board meeting agenda.

◆ **Practical Exam**

There has been discussion to eliminate the practical portion of the exam. In the packet is a draft rule change to remove practical exams. If approved, it would go to the 2020 legislature. Board Member Pond is not in favor of the state relinquishing the ability to test for the practical course. Board Member Oberhofer reached out to the state of Montana regarding the practical exams in a classroom setting. The Chairman agreed for Board Member Oberhofer to provide Montana’s information to the Administrative Assistant for distribution to the Board and DBS.

ACTION: The Administrative Assistant will provide Montana’s documentation regarding practical exams to the Board and DBS once received by Board Member Oberhofer.

Board Member Pond offered to chair a committee; bringing suggestions back to the May 2019 Board meeting. DBS Regional Manager Adam Bowcutt, and Board Member Oberhofer volunteered. Regional Manager Bowcutt will contact the city of Idaho Falls Inspector Garret Christoffersen to be on the committee as well.

At the request of the Chairman, the topic *Practical Exam* will be placed on the May 2019 board meeting agenda as an action item since it will be the last meeting before the deadline to submit rule changes for the 2020 legislature.

ACTION: The topic *Practical Exam* will be placed as an action item on the agenda for the May 2019 Plumbing Board meeting.

◆ **Contractor Testing**

Beginning April 1, 2019, the Plumbing Contractor Exam will change to 50 code and 50 business questions. The 2017 Idaho State Plumbing Code book and Contractor’s Business and Law Reference manual will be needed to take the exam.

The proposed change in Idaho Code § 54-2611(a) *Classification of Competency* did not pass the 2019 legislature. Chairman Gardner acknowledged many in the industry feel strongly the issue with the language in statute and rule contradict each other.

Teri Ottens, Treasure Valley Master Plumbers Association, stated members on the Commerce and Business Committee do not understand an individual can be a business owner by having a plumbing journeyman and plumbing contractor work for them. Board members and industry were encouraged to attend future legislative hearings. If unable to attend, phone or write their congress person.

DBS was asked to bring proposed language to the May 2019 meeting for the Board to vote whether to send the draft rule to the 2020 legislative session.

ACTION: The Plumbing Program Manager will provide the proposed rule change at the May 2019 Board meeting.

ACTION: The topic *Contractor Testing* will be placed as an action item on the May 2019 Plumbing Board meeting agenda.

◆ **Governor’s Executive Orders (EO)**

In January 2019, Governor Brad Little issued the following executive orders:

Executive Order 2019-01 *Licensing Freedom Act 2019* – Provides additional information on the Licensing Freedom Act, originally introduced in Executive Order (EO) 2017-06. The top two recommendations in the new EO establishes a “sunrise” review process for new proposed licenses and a “sunset” review process on existing licenses.

Executive Order 2019-02 *Red Tape Reduction Act* – Requires agencies to designate an existing employee as its Rules Review Officer; which is Regional Manager Patrick J. Grace for DBS. Prior to proposing a new rule, each agency shall submit to the Division of Financial Management an impact statement; identifying the impact the proposed rule will have on individuals and small businesses. In addition, at least two existing rules will need to be repealed or significantly simplified, or a statement clearly and thoroughly stating why existing rules cannot be simplified or eliminated.

◆ **Program Manager Report**

2019 Legislation – The following proposed rules passed and will become effective sine die of the legislature: 1) ISPC Table 501.1(1) First Hour Rating, and 2) ISPC Section 603.5.12 Beverage Dispensers. The following did not pass: 1) Rule change on cleanouts and 2) Statute change to Idaho Code § 54-2611(a) Classification of Competency. (The statute change was discussed under the topic *Contractor Testing*.)

Official Magazine – A story about Idaho will be in the spring edition of *Official Magazine*, and will feature Dan Ediger, plumbing inspector supervisor for the city of Boise.

◆ **Compliance Program Report**

The Compliance Program Specialist has seen an increase in violations as she continues to receive input from inspectors from other jurisdictions.

◆ **May 16, 2019 Board Meeting** – The Chairman has a conflict with the May 16, 2019 Board meeting and has asked to change it to May 15, 2019. The Administrative Assistant will review the Board Meeting calendar; confirming whether the Division’s Meridian, Coeur d’Alene and Pocatello conference rooms are available.

ACTION: The Administrative Assistant will e-mail the Board and staff the availability of the Division’s three conference rooms for May 15, 2019.

◆ **Administrator Report**

Financial Report – The Board’s finances are in good condition with revenue slightly exceeding one-year in reserve.

Plan Reviews – The Division’s plan reviewers are currently busy with state projects.

Katerra Factory – A factory to be built in Meridian that will produce building components and materials, to include lighting, cabinetry, truss assemblies, wall panels, and more. Most of the products will be built by robots.

◆ **Old/New Business**

There were no old or new issues to address.

◆ **Adjournment**

Agenda Item No. 02 Amendments to Idaho Code Section 54-2602(1) and 54-2620(2)

PRESENTER: John Nielsen, Plumbing Program Manager

OBJECTIVE: Approve Amendments to Idaho Code Sections 54-2602(1) and 54-2620(2).

ACTION: Vote to Approve Amendments to Idaho Code Sections 54-2602(1) and 54-2620(2) to Provide Exception from Licensing Requirements for Manufactured or Mobile Home Installers

BACKGROUND: Currently there are two licenses issued by DBS that allow for the connections of sewer and water to existing manufactured homes on site. One is a plumbing specialty license for mobile home installers, based on plumbing statute and rules, and the other is an installer license, based on building statute and rules. Plumbing Program Manager John Nielsen recommended eliminating the mobile home specialty license since post 1976 manufactured homes have their own installations standards and are regulated by HUD.

RELATING TO ; AMENDING SECTION 54-2602, IDAHO CODE, TO _____
_____; AND AMENDING SECTION 54-2620,
IDAHO CODE, TO _____.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1: That Section 54-2902, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

54-2602. EXCEPTIONS. (1) Certificate of competency requirements of this chapter shall not be deemed to apply to:

- (a) Any person who does plumbing work in a single or duplex family dwelling, including accessory buildings, quarters and grounds in connection with such dwelling; provided that such person owns or is a contract purchaser of the premises, and provided further that such person shall comply with the minimum standards and rules applicable to plumbing practices provided by this chapter.
- (b) Farm buildings located outside the incorporated limits of any city unless such buildings are connected to a public water or sewer system; and a farm building is hereby defined to be a structure located on agricultural zoned property and designed and constructed to house farm implements, hay, grain, poultry, livestock or other horticultural products and includes sheds, barns, corrals or fences. This definition does not include a place for human habitation or a place of regular employment where agricultural products are extracted, processed, treated or packaged; a place used by the public; or conditioned livestock housing.
- (c) Logging, mining or construction camps when plumbing installations are made to conform with the recommendations of the department of health and welfare.
- (d) Piping systems in industrial processing plants located outside the incorporated limits of any city unless such systems are connected to a public water or sewer system.
- (e) Work on plumbing systems on premises owned or operated by an employer who regularly employs maintenance or construction plumbers, provided that alterations, extensions and new construction shall comply with the minimum standards and rules applicable to plumbing practices provided by this chapter.
- (f) Nothing contained in this section or any other provision of this code shall be construed or applied to require a sewer contractor, sewage disposal contractor, or any excavating or utility contractor who generally engages in the business of installing,

altering or repairing sewers, private and public sewage disposal systems, and water distribution and/or drainage lines outside the foundation walls of any building or structure, to obtain a valid contractor's certificate of competency or to employ only journeymen plumbers possessing a valid journeyman plumber's certificate of competency or registration, or to in any way require that his employees be registered, licensed or declared competent by the board.

(g) Water treatment installations and repairs when installed in residential or business properties, provided the same, when installed, repaired or completed, shall be inspected by a designated, qualified and properly identified agent of the division of building safety as to quality of workmanship and compliance with the applicable provisions of this chapter.

(h) Plumbing work within modular buildings as defined in section 39-4301, Idaho Code, that are constructed in the state of Idaho for installation on building sites outside the state; provided however, that no modular building shall be installed on a building site in the state of Idaho until it has been approved and bears the insignia of approval of the division as being in compliance with the requirements set forth in section 39-4304, Idaho Code.

(i) Individuals holding a current installer license pursuant to the provisions of chapter 21, title 44, Idaho Code, may make connections of sewer and water facilities on site.

(ii) Individuals licensed pursuant to chapter 10, title 54, Idaho Code, or chapter 50, title 54, Idaho Code, as follows:

(i) Individuals holding a current HVAC or electrical license may install electrical circuitry from the disconnecting means to a water heater and electrical connections to the water heater as long as the disconnect is in sight from the unit and the circuit from the disconnecting means to the water heater is no more than fifty (50) feet long.

(ii) Individuals holding a current HVAC license may install gas piping and piping for hydronic systems.

(iii) Individuals holding a current HVAC license may install boilers that are not otherwise subject to inspection by the industrial commission or its authorized agent.

(2) To the extent that an electrical or HVAC installation permit issued by the Idaho division of building safety includes any part of a plumbing installation, the permit issued and inspection performed shall be sufficient to satisfy the permitting and inspecting requirements of this chapter if all required permit fees have been paid.

(3) Apprentice registration requirements shall not apply to high school students enrolled in an educational program recognized by the board in which the performance of plumbing installation is a formal component of the program. The exemption is limited to students performing residential installations as part of such program under the constant on-the-job supervision of a licensed journeyman plumber, and a permit for the work is obtained from the authority having jurisdiction. Work hours performed by such students shall not apply toward apprentice work requirements.

(4) Any person, firm, copartnership, association or corporation making water treatment installations and/or repairs in accordance with the provisions of this chapter shall maintain a surety bond in the amount of two thousand dollars (\$2,000).

SECTION 2: That Section 54-2620, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

54-2620. PERMITS REQUIRED — EXCEPTIONS. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, copartnership, association or corporation to do, or cause or permit to be done, after the adoption of this act, whether acting as principal, agent or employee, any construction, installation, improvement, extension or alteration of any plumbing system in any building, residence or structure, or service lines thereto, in the state of Idaho, without first procuring a permit from the division of building safety authorizing such work to be done, except:

(1) Within the boundaries of incorporated cities, including those specially chartered, where such work is regulated and enforced by an ordinance or code equivalent to this chapter;

(2) Within such additional area within five (5) miles of the city limits over which such city has elected to exercise jurisdiction relative to building drains and building sewers pursuant to section 50-606, Idaho Code, on buildings, residences and structures being converted from an on-site sewage disposal system to a sewage disposal system supplied by the city, where such work is regulated and enforced by an ordinance or code equivalent to this chapter. Cities shall provide the division of building safety written notice of the area over which such jurisdiction will be exercised. No city may exercise such jurisdiction within the limits of another city unless both cities have agreed by ordinance to allow such jurisdiction. For purposes of this chapter building drain and building sewer will be defined according to the definition found in the uniform plumbing code or as adopted by the board, pursuant to section 54-2601, Idaho Code.

Permits shall be issued only to a person, ~~or holding a valid certificate of competency;~~ to a firm, copartnership, association or corporation represented by a person holding a valid certificate of competency; or to a person ~~who does his own or for~~ work ~~in a family dwelling as defined in~~ excepted from the certificate of competency requirements of this chapter pursuant to section 54-2602(1)(a), (1)(e), (1)(f), (1)(g), or (1)(i) Idaho Code, ~~except that p.~~ Permits shall not be required for plumbing work as defined in section 54-2602(1)(b), (1)(c) and or (1)(d), Idaho Code.

Provided, a licensed plumber is hereby authorized, after making application for permit and pending receipt of permit, to proceed and complete improvements or alterations to plumbing systems, when the cost of said improvement or alteration does not exceed the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500). Inspection of such work shall be the responsibility of the permit holder pending an official inspection, which shall be made within sixty (60) days after notification of inspection.

Agenda Item No. 03a Elimination of Practical Exam Through IDAPA 07.02.05

PRESENTER: John Nielsen, Plumbing Program Manager

OBJECTIVE: No longer require a practical exam to become an Idaho journeyman.

ACTION: Vote to remove the practical exam from IDAPA 07.02.05.

BACKGROUND: June 2018 – Board Member Garrett questioned who administers the practical portion of the journeyman exam throughout the state, and if it could be managed through the school system for better control and equality.

September 2018 – Board Member Garrett brought forth the idea of incorporating the practical into the fourth-year apprenticeship course. There are a couple of mock-up labs; however, it is impossible to fail if an individual has any remote training at all. Board Member Pond recommended, through a test site or correlate through the colleges, creating applications on ABS, copper, and cast-iron.

January 2019 – The requirement for a practical exam is in rule. Suggestions for a practical were: 1) One of the final exams, 2) Completion letter at end of each school year on whether a practical passed/failed, and 3) Competency exam after each section/chapter. It was agreed the current practical is not working and should be removed from rule. Board Member Garrett instructed DBS move forward with rewriting the definition and requirements of the journeyman exam.

March 2019 – In the packet is a draft rule change to remove practical exams. If approved, it would go to the 2020 legislature. Board Member Pond is not in favor of the state relinquishing the ability to test for the practical course. Board Member Oberhofer reached out to the state of Montana regarding the practical exams in a classroom setting. Board Member Pond offered to chair a committee; bringing suggestions to the May 2019 Board meeting. DBS Regional Manager Bowcutt, and Board Member Oberhofer volunteered. Regional Manager Bowcutt will contact the city of Idaho Falls Inspector Garret Christoffersen to be on the committee. At the request of the Chairman, the topic *Practical Exam* will be placed on the May 2019 board meeting agenda as an action item since it will be the last meeting before the deadline to submit rule changes for the 2020 legislature.

TITLE 02
CHAPTER 05**

07.02.05 – RULES GOVERNING PLUMBING SAFETY LICENSING

011. APPRENTICE REGISTRATION.

A person wishing to become a plumbing apprentice shall register with the Division of Building Safety prior to going to work. All apprentices shall pay the registration fee as prescribed by Section 54-2614, Idaho Code. The minimum age for any apprentice shall be sixteen (16) years. No examination is required for such registration. In order to maintain registration, the apprentice shall renew his registration in accordance with Sections 54-2614 and 54-2614A, Idaho Code. (3-29-12)

01. Work Requirements. A plumbing apprentice must work at the trade under the constant on-the-job supervision of a journeyman and in the employ of a contractor for a total of four (4) years, defined as a minimum of eight thousand (8,000) hours work experience in order to be eligible for a journeyman certificate of competency. (3-29-12)

02. Schooling Requirements. A plumbing apprentice must complete an Idaho Plumbing Board approved related course of instruction for four (4) years in order to be eligible for a journeyman certificate of competency. Unless prior approval has been granted by the Division of Building Safety, the apprentice must complete the required course work sequentially: year one (1) must be completed prior to beginning year two (2); year two (2) must be completed prior to beginning year three (3); and year three (3) must be completed prior to beginning year four (4). A minimum of one hundred forty-four (144) hours of classroom or other Idaho Plumbing Board-approved instruction time per school year is required. A grade average of seventy percent (70%) must be attained in these courses. Upon completion of apprenticeship schooling, the apprentice must obtain a certificate of completion, or a letter signed by the chairman of his apprenticeship committee, and attach the certificate or letter to his application for a journeyman license. (3-29-12)

03. Journeyman Examination. (3-29-12)

a. Any plumbing apprentice who desires to take the written portion of the journeyman examination shall complete an Idaho Plumbing Board approved related course of instruction for four (4) years as described in Subsection 011.02 of these rules prior to the date of the exam and provide a certificate of completion with the application for examination. All apprentices shall pay the registration fee as prescribed by Section 54-2614, Idaho Code. The minimum age for any apprentice shall be sixteen (16) years. No examination is required for such registration. In order to maintain registration, the apprentice shall renew his registration in accordance with Sections 54-2614 and 54-2614A, Idaho Code. A minimum of one hundred forty-four (144) hours of classroom or other Idaho Plumbing Board-approved instruction time per school year is required. A grade average of seventy percent (70%) must be attained in these courses. Upon completion of apprenticeship schooling, the apprentice must obtain a certificate of completion, or a letter signed by the chairman of his apprenticeship committee, and attach the certificate or letter to his application for a journeyman license. BACKGROUND: March 2019 – Board Member Pond expressed concern CE Broker does not approve additional credit when a CEU course, with the same course number, is taken multiple times in a licensing period. It is his understanding the intent of the plumbing rule is any CEU course taken, regardless of course number, approved by DBS, is allowable and should be accepted. Board Member Garrett emphasized CEUs are to broaden a plumber’s experience and knowledge; therefore, additional credit should not be given when taking the same course multiple times. The problem seems to be with online versus classroom courses. Online courses do not change from year to year; however, classroom courses, with same course number, are taught every year but with different material.

Board Member Oberhofer addressed the bizarre format the current list of approved plumbing courses in Idaho is when downloading from the Division’s website. Licensing and Permitting Supervisor Laura Shankel will investigate this issue. For the May 2019 Board meeting, the Chairman asked DBS to provide input on what it will take to be able to get credit for classroom versus online courses. Another issue by Board Member Pond is to get a free ID number with CE Broker, an individual must go down to the bottom of their website to apply, which is very confusing. Mrs. Shankel will research this as well.

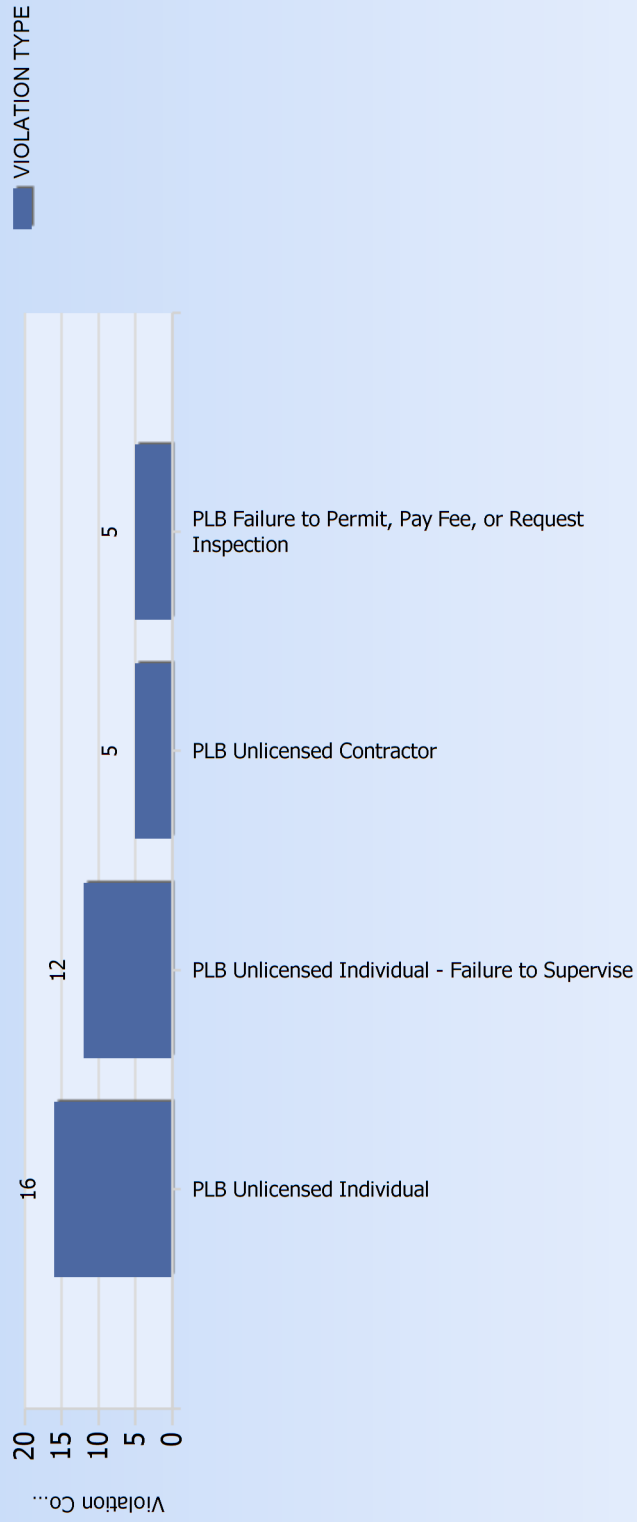

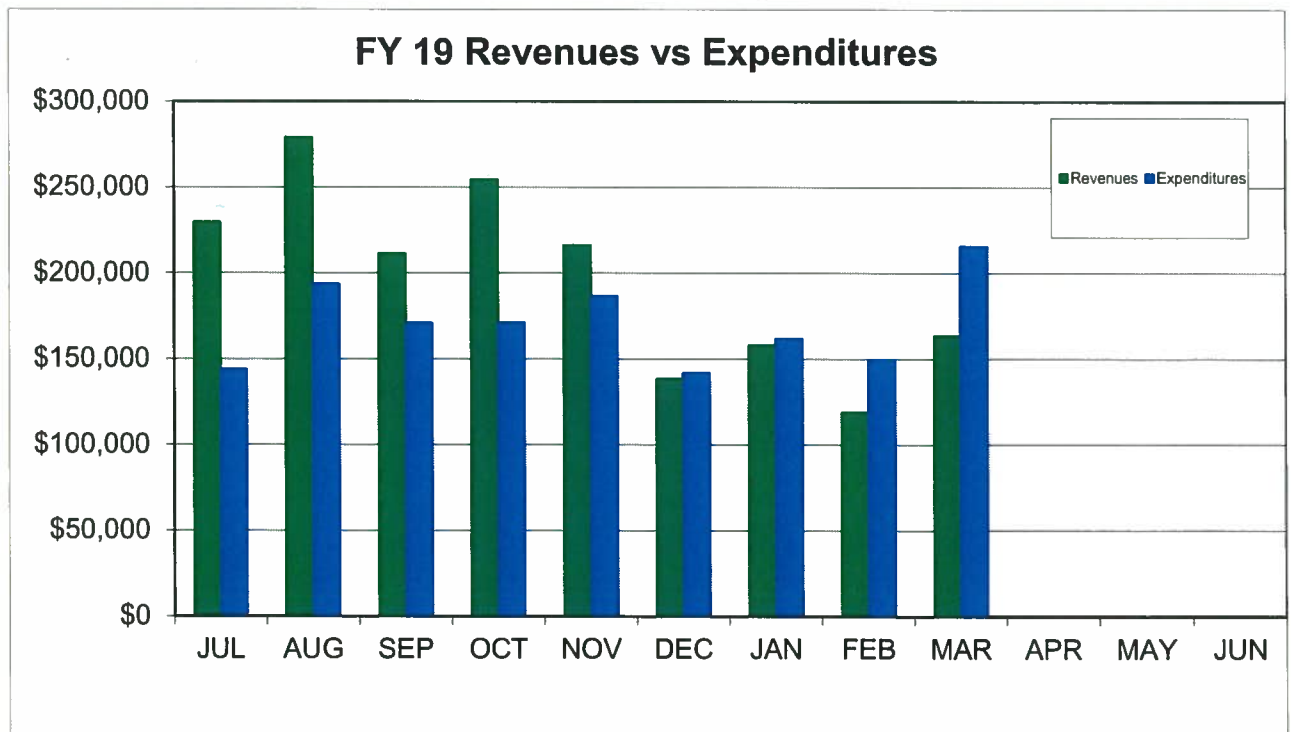
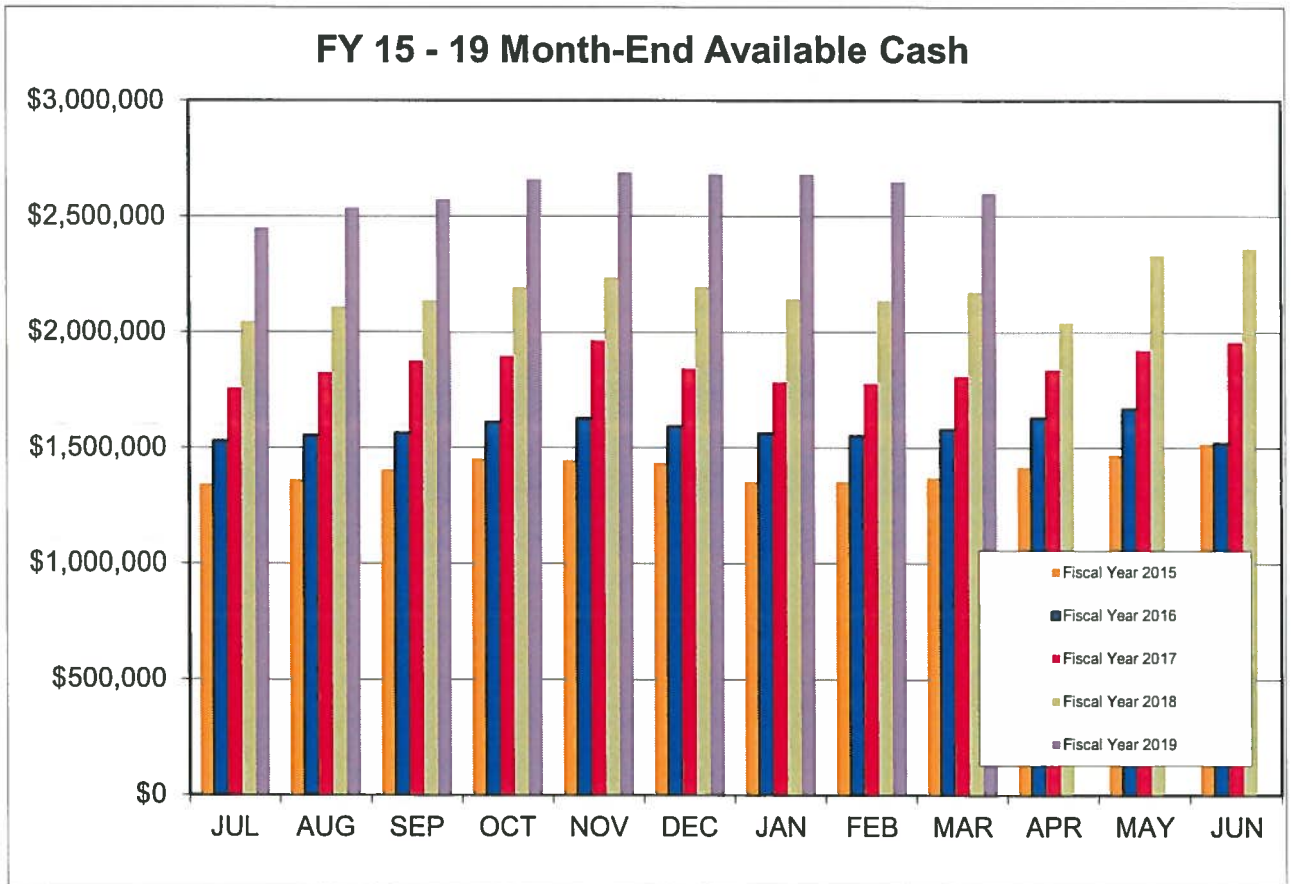
